Francis Mona Chollet Patricia Bissa Enama Maryse Condé Maryse Condé* an extraordinary storyteller bernardine evaristo people say that on the first night francis sancher spent in rivièrè au sel the wind in its temper screamed down from the mountains francis sancher always said he would come to an unnatural end so when this handsome newcomer to the guadeloupean village of rivièrè au sel is found

dead face down in the mud no one is particularly surprised loved by some especially women and reviled by others francis was an enigmatic figure where did he come from what caused his strange nocturnal wanderings what devils haunted him as the villagers come to pay their respects they each reveal another piece of the mystery behind his life and death and their own buried secrets and stories come to light the grand queen the empress of caribbean literature fiammetta rocco guardian

it is impossible to read her novels and not come away from them with both a sadder and more exhilarating understanding of the human heart the new york times book review rapidly shifting between guadeloupe and harlem moving from haiti s desperate slums to the exclusive enclaves of the parisian upper class this deeply personal tale traces one guadeloupe family s rise from poverty to riches through several generations

possessing one of the most vital voices in international letters maryse condé added to an already acclaimed career the new academy prize in literature in 2018 the twelfth novel by this celebrated author revolves around an enigmatic crime and the young man at its center dieudonné sabrina a gardener aged twenty two and black is accused of murdering his employer and lover loraine a wealthy white woman descended from plantation owners his only refuge is a sailboat la belle créole a relic of times gone by condé follows dieudonné s desperate wanderings through the city of port mahault the night of his acquittal the narrative unfolding through a series of multivoiced flashbacks set against a forbidding backdrop of social disintegration and tumultuous labor strikes in turn of the twenty first century guadeloupe twenty four hours later dieudonné s fate becomes suggestively intertwined with that of the french island itself though the future of both remains uncertain in the end echoes of faulkner and lawrence and even shakespeare s othello resonate in this tale yet the drama s uniquely modern dynamics set it apart from any model in its exploration of love and hate politics and stereotype and the attempt to find connections with others across barriers through her vividly and intimately drawn characters condé paints a rich portrait of a contemporary society grappling with the heritage of slavery racism and colonization

franzosen kolonisiert und damit wie die meisten europäischen kolonien zum schauplatz von rund 300 jahren ausrottung sklaverei plantagenökonomie und unterdrückung die insel wurde zum schmelztiegel indianischer europäischer afrikanischer und asiatischer bevölkerungsgruppen und kulturtraditionen im 20 jahrhundert wurden die meisten besetzten inseln unabhängig doch guadeloupe und die nachbarinsel martinique haben seit 1946 den status als Überseedepartements départements d'outre mer und sind bis heute frankreich gleichgestellt vgl gewecke 1988 s 16 19 im klassischen sinne sind sie nicht postkolonial da sie immer noch politisch wirtschaftlich und kulturell von der französischen metropole paris abhängig sind diese identitätsproblematik ist auch thema vieler kritischer aufsätze antillanischer schriftsteller wie aimé césaire einer der gründer der négritudebewegung in den dreißiger jahren edouard glissant der mit seinem discours antillais die antillanität beschreibt sowie jean bernabé raphaël confiant und patrick chamoiseau welche mit ihrem werk *Éloge de la créolité* ihre kreolische identität proklamierten in der vorliegenden arbeit soll die frage untersucht werden wie die antillanische schriftstellerin maryse condé unter diesen umständen ihre identität findet und welche bedeutung das exil und die rückkehr ins heimatland für sie hat ein anderes ziel dieser analyse ist es zu ermitteln wie sich die präsenz der verschiedenen kulturellen elemente die sich im laufe der geschichte gebildet haben sich in ihrer literatur niederschlagen und inwiefern ihr werk teil der kreolitäts und antillanitätsbewegung ist dazu möchte ich auf das werk *traversée de la mangrove* von maryse condé eingehen welches 1989 publiziert wurde in demselben jahr in dem auch das oben genannte werk *Éloge de la créolité* von edouard glissant erschien in dem ersten teil der vorliegenden arbeit stelle ich eine biographische kurzfassung der autorin dar um danach das werk selbst vorzustellen in dem zweiten teil analysiere ich die charaktere sowie den inhalt um diese mit den intentionen der autorin zu verknüpfen schließlich ziehe ich mein fazit daraus

after french colonial rule ended francophone authors began rewriting narratives from the colonial literary canon felisa vergara reynolds presents these textual revisions as figurative acts of cannibalism and examines how these literary cannibalizations critique colonialism and its legacy in each author s homeland

a biography of the revolutionary philosopher and psychiatrist doctor militant essayist ambassador teacher journalist pan africanist frantz fanon sought to decolonize mid twentieth century culture as he embodied a new kind of intellectual born in colonial martinique he fought for france during world war ii but later renounced his

citizenship and fought in the algerian war of independence this book emphasizes fanon s gift for self invention and performance as it follows his short but extraordinary life and explores how his pioneering work in psychiatry influenced his revolutionary philosophy

thesis m a from the year 2005 in the subject american studies literature grade 2 3 ernst moritz arndt university of greifswald language english abstract the paper is concerned with the depiction of black women s subjugation and resistance in fiction it examines the quality of black women s suffering through racism and sexism especially within the system of slavery in america from the 17th to the 19th century moreover the paper contrasts black women s status in and after slavery this is done on the one hand in order to illustrate and underline slavery s inhuman conditions black women suffered from and on the other hand to show the continuation of racism and sexism after slavery it will be revealed that the assumed changes of conditions for black women nowadays are rather superficial and that discrimination and inequality compared to men and white people have been persisting the study is based on the novels beloved and sula by toni morrison and on maryse condé s novel i tituba black witch of salem these three novels are selected as basis for the analysis because they depict black people s oppression in several forms intensities and times and focus especially on women s particular situation it will be discussed how blacks were capable at all to endure and survive the physical and mental tortures of captivity in slavery or of discrimination and inequality after slavery connected with this question the role of the african culture is debated here attention is turned to the authors african roots and the question how much these roots inspired the elements of the actions and in what respect african tradition and beliefs are interwoven in the books being further backing aspects for the novels women human interpersonal relationships and collectivity are examined connected with a consideration of the novels investigation and analysis of human nature psyche and emotions here the analysis focuses on questions that are essential for an entire comprehension of the books for example how are feelings especially love presented and which special functions do they fulfill in the works what significance do the various interpersonal relationships have to what extent are they cores of resistance what causes the significance of female friendships what differentiates female suffering from male this paper claims to elucidate the profound meaning morrison s and condé s insights into black women s present and past provide and their works potential to be far more than just entertaining pieces of magic realism

odious caribbean women and the palpable aesthetics of transgression examines the methods through which the works of french caribbean women resist hedonistic conceptions of pleasure art for art s sake aestheticism and commodification through representations of uglified spaces transgressive deglamorified women s bodies in pain and explicit corporeal and sexual behaviors gladys m francis offers an original approach through her reading together of the literary visual and performing arts as well as traditional caribbean dance music and oral practices to arrive at a transregional trans caribbean and transatlantic trans genre with regard to forms of text and transdisciplinary conversation in francophone studies postcolonial studies and cultural studies this interweaving is illustrated through the artistic engagements of artists such as ina césaire maryse condé sylvaine dampierre fabienne kanor lénablou béatrice mélina gisèle pineau simone schwarz bart and miriam warner vieyra how can we investigate theoretically or critically the aesthetically displeasing found in depictions of odious female protagonists or female performers what is the aesthetic value of transgressional women s bodies this book presents novel tools to understand how these women artists mark and re instate embodied trauma survival and resistance into history it posits that cultural performances can disrupt a culture as text ethnocentrism for these works provide the means to expose the tangible aesthetics through which the body becomes an archive that bears the psychological physical and structural suffering this project also demonstrates the ways through which the corporeal realm offered by these transgressive works through explicit female perspectives on sex love and gender challenges our moral sensibilities works to sabotage the voyeuristic gaze and stimulates a new methodology for reading the women s body it focuses on the complex layers of identity formation and bodily representations with respect to issues of sex consumerism commodification violence gender and women studies and ethics and moral issues
